Battery Gadsden Cultural Center, The National Park Service and Doreen Larimer present, “Discovering the History of Your Lowcountry Property” on Oct. 19 from 6-7 p.m. at the Fort Moultrie Visitor Center Auditorium (1214 Middle St., Sullivan’s Island, SC).

Titles to property in the Lowcountry date back to the 1600s, and South Carolina has a rich trove of land records that document ownership dating back to the original land grants. The invited speaker, Doreen Larimer, is a real estate abstractor who has 35 years of experience in the Lowcountry with special expertise in historic property title searches including those deeded by King’s Grant.

This presentation promises to be of interest to all of us who are curious about the previous owners of our property, the location of an ancestor’s home, or the price paid for the house down the street. Doreen Larimer will explain basic terminology, how to navigate the County’s web sites, and how to build a chain of title, using examples from the 1600s to the present.
